DOCUMENTARIES

A Mined Future (40 mins) Viewers take a trip to Southern Lebanon in this heart-breaking documentary. After a long civil war, Syrian military intervention and constant Israeli assaults the people of Lebanon continue to face a dormant and especially devastating threat from landmines. Viewers witness the noble efforts of the Lebanese Army, UN forces, and the NGOs that risk their lives daily in an effort to demine these areas and pave the way for a brighter future.

Airport Rising (74 mins) Viewers follow an international team of architects, engineers & airport operators who have a dream – the world's fastest built international airport, built from scratch in 3 years in the southern Indian metropolis – Hyderabad. They run into a wide range of challenges; from an unstable traffic control tower and a sudden expansion plan that almost derails completion timelines, to a workers strike that threatens to crash-land the entire project.



Band Without Borders (52 x 30 mins) **HDTV** The Last Supper is a band with a goal: to break the world record for most countries toured by a band. Totally unscripted and raw, the show is set against the most exotic locales on the planet, from the Great Wall of China and the Arabian desert to the nightclubs of London and Istanbul. The group has played more than 700 live shows across four continents, and played with acts including Iron Maiden, Joe Cocker, Peter Frampton, Thin Lizzy, Our Lady Peace, Slash's Snakepit, The Tea Party, Ministry, and Queensryche.

Crossing Our Borders (60 mins) Narrated by Maria Cochita Alonso, this documentary analyzes the revolutions, populist movements and dictatorships that have made sound governance an impossibility in parts of Latin America as millions flee to the US and other developed nations. The focus of the film is Hugo Chavez and the "Bolivarian Revolution" in Venezuela.



Einstein (60 mins) Born in Ulm, Wurttemberg in the German Empire, Albert Einstein grew to become one of the most recognized theoretical physicists of our time, along the way delving into philosophy and other realms of intellectualism. This documentary tells the intriguing story of the colorful personality that is known as the father of modern physics and his many contributions to science and society, including his general theory of relativity.

The Extraordinary Life of Amelia Earhart (60 mins) Amelia Earhart lived a life of perseverance, pioneering the way for female pilots and encouraging women everywhere to follow their dreams by becoming the first woman to receive distinctions in aviation previously only awarded to men. This film tells the story of her adventurous life until her death while trying to become the first woman to circumnavigate the globe in 1937.



Fidel Castro (60 mins) Born in 1927, he has spent his entire life charging forward. First he entered into battle against the Dominican dictatorship of Trujillo, then he organized the armed revolution against Batista's dictatorship. This documentary tells the story of the seemingly eternal leader of Cuba including curious details about his private life.

Football Made in Africa (50 x 90 secs) **HDTV** With the 2010 World Cup just months away, this series of short clips captures the world's second most populous continent engaged in its favorite pastime. The films are funny, quirky and poetic snapshots that engage, not the Africa of conflict and poverty, but one that shows a capable and empowered spirit through football.



Going Long, Going Hard (60 mins) **HDTV** This film follows athletes engaged in the Epic Camp triathlon camp in New Zealand. The world's top ironman athletes are pitted against the uncompromising New Zealand landscape as they swim, cycle and run 2,200 km through some of the most scenic backdrops in the world, with humor and drama along the way.

The History of Soccer (60 mins) This series features a showcase of the World Cup, the all-time classic match-ups, the events and highlights that have now become legend. From the first 1930 World Cup to the 1970 World Cup in Mexico, the entire history of soccer in often unpublished filmed shots.



Inside Mumbai Terror Attacks (50 mins) On November 26, 2008 ten gunmen struck a Mumbai hotel with military precision. This film revisits the 60 hours in which ten attackers paralyzed a city of 19 million, shocking the world by killing 166 people, injuring 304 and grabbing international attention by escalating tensions between two nuclear states.

The Wounded Planet (60 mins) From the evolution of human kind to modern man, this documentary shows how men influenced the world: from land to water and air pollution. Will the new technologies help us to stop global warming?



The Mystery of Sherlock Holmes (60 mins) This documentary traces the origins of the now legendary character and precursor of modern day crime scene forensic investigators, raising the question of whether Sherlock Holmes was a fictional character or based on a real historical figure.

Olympic Taxi (2 x 60 mins) **HDTV** is a documentary project that gives an intimate portrait of contemporary China by exploring the world of Beijing's taxi drivers. The picture viewers usually get about China through media often focuses on macroeconomics and broad social issues without considering the everyday life experiences of ordinary people. The Interviews with taxi drivers have not been monitored, planned or censored by any governmental or private authority.



Paddle to Seattle (52 or 86 mins) **HDTV** Paddle to Seattle: Journey Through the Inside Passage is a documentary chronicling two adventurers as they paddle handmade wooden kayaks along Canada's West coast, from Alaska to Seattle. As they navigate the 1,300 mile inside passage, they encounter brown bears, come frighteningly close to whales and other marine life, and meet the local people.

Rescue Men (60 mins) **HDTV** This is the remarkable true story of the Pea Island Life-Savers, the first all-black crew in the US Life-Saving Service of the 1890s. These brave men rescued sailors and civilians battered by the hard winds and waves of the Atlantic Ocean off the coast of North Carolina. Led by Keeper Richard Etheridge, this groundbreaking crew etched themselves into the history of what is now the US Coast Guard.

Shipwrecks of North America (60 mins) Viewers revisit some of the greatest shipwreck disasters of all time, such as the Titanic, Andrew Doria, Edmund Fitzgerald and more. The film is enhanced with rare

underwater footage, photos, artwork and the analysis of maritime historians.

Backpacker Destinations (58 x 60 mins) **HDTV** This beautiful HD series explores some of the best travel destinations in the world with special emphasis on experiences that can be replicated by just about anybody travelling with a limited budget and possessions. Our hosts take viewers through some of the highlights and challenges they may encounter while exploring places like Thailand, Cambodia, India, Turkey, Japan, Nepal, The Philippines, Malaysia, Cuba, South Africa, Egypt and various countries in South America.

Faces of South America (4 x 60 mins) This series is an encounter with the cultures of Peru, the heart of where great South American civilizations were born. Host Nathalia Delgado takes viewers into a primordial world as they meet the seemingly timeless rainforest tribes and people of the Andean Mountains, still loyal to the Inca legacy from which they derive much of their identity.



The Magic of...(13 x 60 mins) **HDTV** The producers that brought you the Fantastic Festivals of the World series present a visually stunning HD series that delves comprehensively into the rich cultures of the world. Viewers explore the culture, cuisine, landscape and traditions of the world's most captivating regions including Hong Kong, Burgundy (France), Sicily, Taiwan, Yorkshire (England), Wales and more!



Shanghai Discovery (6 x 60 mins) **HDTV** This series delves deep into Shanghai, including fashion, cuisine, its massive suburban movement, traditional events and the upcoming World Expo 2010. In all things, Shanghai remains dynamic, its features diverse and rich, sometimes extending far back into history and in other instances showcasing its constant drive towards innovation.

All For Liberty (88 mins) **HDTV** All For Liberty is a feature film based on the true story of Captain Henry Felder whose determination to resist tyranny led to his long and bitter fight against the British Empire during America's War for independence. Felder's stand, along with other militia leaders in South Carolina from 1776-1780, was instrumental in diverting British troops while George Washington's army far to the north managed to survive and persevere to victory.



The Choo Choo Bob Show (6 x 30 mins) **HDTV** This live action show is target at kids but fun for train fanatics of all ages.
